





3 YEAR OLD PRESCHOOL

This 30-week program is open to all students who will be 3 years old on or before September 1st Classes are offered two (2) days per week, two (2) hours per day. The total cost for tuition and fees is \$870 A minimum deposit of \$170 per student is due upon completion of the on-line registration process (deposit includes a non-refundable \$50 registration and \$20 supply fee). If payment is not made in full at registration, a monthly tuition payment plan is available.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL LATCHKEY

- Latchkey registration begins August 1st Register online at www.wcskids.net.
- Students must be enrolled in WCS grades TK-5 to attend before-school after-school Latchkey at their home
- Before-school Latchkey is designed for families who need child care before tamilies who need child care before school. Latchkey is available beginning a 6:45 a.m. at each elementary building. The cost for attending before-school Latchkey is \$5.00° per day for each student who attends
- After-school Latchkey is designed for families who need child care from the time school dismisses until 8:00 p.m. The cost for attending after-school Latchkey is \$7.00° per day for each child to attends. Latchkey is also available 1/2 days for a cost of \$15.00 per day or each child who attends
- Discounts for families with multiple children are not available
- Parents are responsible for providing ransportation to their registered and after school Latchkey site
- *Costs for attending may be subject to ncrease; program availability based on sufficient enrollment.



Kindergarten Waiver Request

According to Michigan Law (MCL 380.1147), if a child residing in Warren Consolidated Schools is no five years of age on September 1, 2023 but will be five years of age not later than December 1, 2023, the parent or legal guardian of that child may enroll the child in kindergarten or transitional kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year if the parent or legal guardian notifies the school district in writing, that he or she intends to enroll the child in kindergarten.

A school district that receives this written notification may make a recommendation to the parent or legal guardian as to whether the child is not ready to enroll in kindergarten due to the child's age or other factors. Regardless of the district recommendation, the parent or legal guardian retains the sole discretion to determine whether or not to enroll the child in kindergarten or transitional kindergarten if the student is five years of age not later than December 1, 2023.

- Know conventions: grammar, spelling, and punctuation.






MATHEMATICS






