

IMPORTANT STATEMENT REGARDING AGENDA TYPO (NOTED TO STUDENTS ON SEPTEMBER 4TH, 2007)

“Students, we would like to point to an important typo in the student agenda. On page 2 of your agenda it is stated that students who receive 3 or more N’s or 1 U on their progress report or report card will lose all their after-school activity privileges until their citizenship grades improve on the next report or report card. Again, that is a typo. **The policy should have read that students who receive 2 or more N’s or 1 U on their progress report or report card will lose all their after-school privileges.** We apologize for the typo but we are confident in your ability to receive outstanding conduct grades.”

Please note that the 2 “N” or 1 “U” policy has been and will continue to be told to all students by classroom teachers, administrators, and coaches.

Conduct Policy: Students are not permitted to participate in school sponsored extra-curricular activities – including athletics - if they receive 2 or more “N”s or 1 “U” on a progress report or report card. Students earn the privilege of participating every 5 weeks.

The conduct grade is an evaluation of student class conduct, and is represented as follows on report cards and progress reports:

O	=	Outstanding
G	=	Good
S	=	Satisfactory
N	=	Needs Improvement
U	=	Unacceptable

Why is conduct important?

Teaching responsible behavior is a vital component of middle school education. Responsible students are better equipped to handle the rigorous demands of school and life. Our conduct policy places greater emphasis on personal responsibility and provides incentives for students to develop their conduct skills.
