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Carter Middle School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for the Carter Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus, or Priority. A Reward school is one that is out-performing other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been identified as a "FOCUS" OR "PRIORITY" School this year.

As a staff, we will continue to address Math and Language Arts within our School Improvement Plan. As a staff, we analyzed our Title I plan and goals for 2013-2014 school year. Carter Middle School struggles to reach our Title I and English Language stakeholders. When considering the MEAP reading proficiency of our 6th grade students, current data indicates a 39% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; a 25% gap between Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 25% gap between African American Students and All Students; a 12% gap between Economically Disadvantaged Students and All Students. When considering the MEAP reading proficiency of our 7th grade current data indicates a 39% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; 38% gap between

Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 26% gap between African American Students and All Students; a 9% gap between Economically Disadvantaged and All Students. Current 8th grade MEAP data indicates a 58% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; a 34% gap between Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 16% gap between African American Students and All Students; a 13% gap between Economically Disadvantaged Students and All Students. Teachers attended training at the MISD, and will begin implementation in 2013-2014. In an effort to address the academic gaps, all of our Language Arts teachers will complete Balanced Literacy training and implement the new district Language Arts curriculum which includes Balanced Literacy, Corrective Reading and the SELCT Program. Adolescent Advanced Reading Initiative (AARI) will be implemented to assist Title I and EL students reach grade level in reading.

When considering the MEAP math proficiency of our 6th grade student's, current data indicates a 26% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; a 22% gap between Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 22% gap between African American Students and All Students; an 11% gap between Economically Disadvantaged Students and All Students. MEAP math proficiency of our 7th grade students indicated a 75% gap between proficiency and the target of 100%. In the 2011-12 school year the gap was 63% and in 2010-11 the gap was 70%. Current data indicates a 13% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; a 21% gap between Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 16% gap between African American Students and All Students; a 6% gap between Economically Disadvantaged Students and All Students. MEAP math proficiency of 8th grade students shows a 74% gap between proficiency and the target of 100%. In the 2011-12 school year the gap was 73% and in 2010-11 the gap was 75%. Current data indicates a 58% gap between English Language Learners and All Students; a 34% gap between Students with Disabilities and All Students; a 16% gap between African American Students and All Students; a 13% gap between Economically Disadvantaged Students and All Students. Math teachers will work to close the math gaps with the training and implementation of Mi-2 to enhance math curriculum for students with learning disabilities. The IXL Program will be implemented school wide in 2013-2014 to assist students who are not proficient in Math (MEAP).

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL – Students are assigned to schools according to their address of residence within the district's boundaries. Parents may request another school within the District under the Open Enrollment process, however, transportation is not provided. The Board of Education has determined that it will allow nonresident students, residing within the Macomb ISD, but whose parent(s) reside in the District, and who qualify to enroll in the District through a Schools of Choice program.
2. Carter Middle School is going into year 3 of a 5 year School Improvement Plan.

- Warren Consolidated Schools offers several specialized programs to meet the needs of a variety of learners.

The **Macomb Math and Science Center (MMSTC)** is an honors program for 9th – 12th grade students in 11 Macomb County districts who are interested in advanced/accelerated mathematics, science, and computer technology. Students must apply and be selected for the program based upon placement testing and teachers recommendation. The Center’s program is a half day and students attend their home school for the remainder of the day.

The **Career Preparation Center (CPC)** programs are open to Clintondale, Fraser, and Warren Consolidated 11th and 12th grade students. CPC programs are designed to provide students with skills to enter the workforce or continue with additional college or workplace training. Career Technical Education (CTE) classes at the CPC provide technical skills and knowledge. Students enrolled in these programs are often able to earn technical certifications as well as college credit.

Community High School and North Star Academy are alternative education programs for middle and high school students. Both programs are located at the Butcher Educational Center.

- Warren Consolidated Schools follows all State of Michigan curriculum guidelines. The Board of Education has adopted a core curriculum based on Michigan Curriculum Framework, Grade-Level Content Expectations/Common Core State Standards, and Michigan Merit Curriculum approved by the State Board of Education. - Carter Middle School has shown significant improvement in Reading and moderate stability in Math. Carter is continuing to close the achievement gaps in Reading and Math. Carter will continue to address the achievement gaps in Science and Writing in the 2013-2014 school year. Carter Middle School is consistently scoring within the WCS district MEAP average.
