Have you every asked yourself the question, “What can I do to help my child do well in school?” Aside from reading with your child, helping with homework, teaching organization and study habits, we now have another way you can help.

Our school now has access to a great resource called **Study Island**. Study Island is a web-based program that can support our students’ learning at school and at home. All you will need is Internet access to be able to use the program. If you do not have Internet access, please contact me directly and I can arrange times for you and your child to use the program before or after school here at Susick.

We are very excited about the benefits Study Island can bring to our students and we encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity with your child. The Study Island programs include questions and games which are based from the National and Michigan Standards.

All Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students have access to the Study Island program and each student has their own username which allows them access at school and home. The Susick students have access to the Language Arts and Math programs that are offered from Study Island.

The students’ individual username will have their first initial (uppercase), with their entire last name (1<sup>st</sup> letter uppercase, the rest lower case), then the @ symbol, then Dragons. The password for all students is 123. We will keep this password so that the students do not forget the password and it will keep the consistency of logging in at home and school.

An example of a student login is:

**Username: PCavanaugh@Dragons**

**Password: 123**

### **Using Study Island from Home**

Since the Study Island program is completely web-based, students can access it from any computer with an Internet connection.

The programs available for Susick students are Language Arts and Math. Each of these sections is 10-25 topics, which contain about 20-25 questions each. Many topics are accompanied by a lesson, which includes some brief information about the material covered by the questions in the topics. It is helpful to view the lesson before answering the questions in the topic.

**Please follow the instructions below, in order to use the program:**

1. Go to [www.studyisland.com](http://www.studyisland.com)
2. Enter your username and password at the upper-left of the screen (for example,  
Username: PCavanaugh@Dragons  
Password: 123
3. Click Submit
4. Click on the section tab (Math or Language Arts)
5. Click the “Pretest” in order to begin the pretest for the section. **The students must complete 10 pretest questions before moving on to the topic in the section.**
6. Once you complete the “Pretest”, you may work through the remainder of the topics in any order you like. You must “pass” all the topics before taking the “Posttest”.
7. To pass a topic, you must satisfy the group’s passing requirements which are based on a minimum number of questions answered (usually 10) and a minimum percentage correct (around 70%). A Blue Ribbon icon is displayed next to all passed topics.
8. Once you have passed all the topics in the section, you have to pass the “Posttest” for the section before the section is complete. Ignore this step if the section has no “Posttest”.

**To access the Reports:**

1. After your child has logged in, select a subject from the left-hand side of the screen to access the reports.
2. Here, you will find a variety of reports with information such as how much time your child has spent on various subjects, how they used their time, and what questions they missed.
